Job Purpose	Provide learning activities for a named pupil with complex needs under the professional direction and supervision of a qualified teacher. HLTAs will plan, prepare and deliver lessons and assess, record and report on development, progress and attainment. This may be at school, in the young person's home or hospital.
Principle Accountabilities	Use teaching and learning objectives to plan challenging lessons/activities and to evaluate and adjust lessons/work plans as appropriate within agreed systems of supervision for one specific pupil with complex needs. Assess the needs of the named pupil and use detailed knowledge and specialist skills to support this pupils' learning. Deliver adjusted learning activities according to pupil responses/needs.
General	 Comply with and assist with the development of policies and procedures relating to child protection, equal opportunities, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting concerns to an appropriate person Be aware of and support difference and ensure all pupils have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school Establish constructive relationships and communicate with other agencies/professionals, including the named pupil's nurse, in liaison with the teacher, to support achievement and progress of pupils To participate in the performance and development review process, taking personal responsibility for identification of learning, development and training opportunities in discussion with line manager. To comply with individual responsibilities, in accordance with the role, for health & safety in the workplace Ensure that all duties and services provided are in accordance with the School's Equal Opportunities Policy
