Job summary:

Help with day to day management of the club
Provide play care within the framework of the club's policies and Procedures

Line manager: Club Manager

Responsible for: Play workers, school escorts, and volunteers in the absence of club manager

Working relationships: Children attending the club and their parents or carers
Club management, club staff and volunteers
Schools, childcare and play organisations, registering authorities
To provide support for any SENCO requirements and to be aware of the procedure to follow.

Main duties include:

- Helping the manager with planning, preparing and delivering quality play opportunities within a safe and caring environment.
- Providing comprehensive care for the children including collecting them from school and delivering them safely to parents/carers.
- Providing support and supervision to play workers and volunteers in the absence of the manager.
- Setting up the play space including moving furniture and play equipment.
- Providing refreshments and ensuring that hygiene, health and safety standards are met.
- Administering first aid when necessary.
- Consulting with children and involving them in planning activities.
- Encouraging parental involvement in the club.
- Facilitating good communication with all members of the organisation, parents, schools and childcare and play related agencies.
- Undertaking appropriate and relevant training.
- Keeping the work environment healthy, safe and secure.
- Working within the framework of the club's policies and procedures, and the Early Years Foundation Stage.
