Ofsted 'Outstanding' (January 2020)

The Sixth Form at Moulsham High School was judged to be 'outstanding' by Ofsted in January 2020. Inspectors agreed that:

'The strengths seen elsewhere in the school are equally evident in the Sixth Form. Expectations are high, and students' next steps well catered for. Advice and guidance for students takes into account their aptitudes and interests...'

An Academic Sixth Form

There are approximately 270 students in the Sixth Form. 15 places each year are reserved for members of the Chelmsford City Football Academy with whom we have been in partnership since 2020. It is a condition of the partnership that all of the academy students meet the Sixth Form's high academic entry requirements.

Provision in the Sixth Form mainly consists of A levels, with level 3 BTECs only currently being offered in Sport and Business.

Sixth Form Leadership Team

The Sixth Form is led by the Head of Sixth Form who is an associate member of SLT. The Head of Sixth Form is supported by two Assistant Heads of Sixth Form,

one of whom leads on Year 13 and destinations and the other on Year 12 and recruitment. Both Assistant Heads of Sixth Form are on TLR 2cs and teach for 40 out of 50 periods a fortnight.

There is also a Sixth Form Pastoral Manager who is a member of the support staff.

The Sixth Form Leadership team are all based in the Chaucer Building which also provides a space for students to study quietly in when they have non -contact periods.

An Integral Part Of The School

The Sixth Form plays an integral part in the life of the whole school. The Student Leadership team: act as role models for younger students; organise charity fundraising; lead the House System and the School Council and support younger students both academically and pastorally.

Developing The Whole Person

While academic success is clearly important, the overriding aim of the Sixth Form is also to develop confident, well-rounded young people who are well prepared for future employment and adult life. A varied, timetabled, enrichment programme and weekly cultural capital lectures provide a wide range of opportunities for personal development. Year 12 students undertake work shadowing. Teams of Year 12 and Year 13 form tutors provide additional support with relationships and sex education, well-being and careers/UCAS guidance.

Destinations

In 2021 83% Year 13 went to university, 3% started degree level apprenticeships, 7% entered employment and 7% took a gap year.
