



Where is our school?



Chrishall Holy Trinity and St. Nicholas C.E. (V.A.) Primary School is situated in the centre of the village of Chrishall, which is a small village in north west Essex, in Uttlesford district, close to both the Hertfordshire and Cambridgeshire borders. Chrishall lies mid-way between the medieval market towns of Saffron Walden and Royston, and is just 14 miles south of the university city of Cambridge. Despite its rural location, Chrishall enjoys easy access to major road systems (M11, A1 & A10) as well as regular train services from Royston and Audley End to both London and



Cambridge.

Chrishall is part of the Parish of the Icknield Way Villages, which is a rural community of seven villages in the very north-west corner of the Chelmsford Diocese in the deanery of Saffron Walden. The parish has villages in both Essex and Cambridgeshire which lie at the very centre of the Icknield Way, the oldest track in Britain and which dates from Neolithic times.

Chrishall is a pretty village with several picturesque thatched houses, and lies at the highest point in Essex at 130 metres above sea level. There has been a community here for at least 900 years as confirmed in the Domesday Book of 1086. Chrishall's population has remained largely unchanged over the last 170 years; in 1841 it totalled 518 and today about 450 people live in the village. The village has a strong community spirit with excellent facilities in addition to the primary school, such as a pre-school, two churches, many clubs and societies, village hall, sports field, adventure playground, as well as a thatched public house, The Red Cow.
