

Our curriculum is designed to offer pathways to success for each individual, regardless of their starting point. When it comes to selecting subjects at Key Stage 4, we strongly believe that parents know what is best for their child. Our pathways process is therefore built around a principle of guided, informed choice.

Growth and development of our young people cannot take place in isolation; it has to be a partnership between our school and the families who place their trust in us. Trips include the hadron collider at CERN, Harry Potter World, the Big Bang Science Fair at the NEC Birmingham, Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge and VEX Robotics to name but a few.

Our students also have a clear stake in our school. With an active Student Council, a team of Prefects, Youth Health Champions, Sports Leaders and Buddies, and a biennial student visioning day, students are empowered to make a positive contribution to many aspects of our school and its provision. We give our young people a real voice within their school and its community.

- A £2.5m Science and Food Technology build consisting of 4 science laboratories, 2 specialist food rooms and a computer room (opened September 2015).
- Playfootball, an all-weather sports facility consisting of 8 floodlit football pitches and a pavilion, available for school use during the day (opened March 2016).
- An amphitheatre, as a result of a project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund designed to celebrate of school site's unique Roman history. The amphitheatre provides an exciting and unique outdoor learning and performance space (completed June 2017).

Current plans include an upgrade of the school's ICT system, developing the school's kitchen/serving area and enhancing our outdoor spaces to create much needed all-weather outdoor social space for our students.
