Job Purpose

- To motivate, engage and heighten the student experience and drive to become physically active and maintain health and fitness.
- To support and mentor teaching school staff to deliver high quality Physical Education curriculum.
- To Support the SESSP Manager in the and the playing of competitive fixtures against other Schools in as
 wide a range of sports as possible and across all year groups. This will include ensuring that the School
 enters local, regional and national competitions, as well as continues to expand the range of prestigious
 fixtures.

Job Responsibilities

- To plan and deliver PE lessons that meet Ofsted and National Curriculum requirements.
- To plan structured coaching sessions (for Out of School Hour clubs) appropriate to the pupils
- To ensure that the activity within each session offers progressive development and differentiation depending on the level of the participants
- To deliver on site support to schools including team building, play leaders, well-being, intervention, play leader training
- To ensure all sessions are delivered in a fun and exciting way to engage participants
- To ensure sport and recreation activities take place in a safe environment with due regard to Health and Safety recommendations
- To demonstrate knowledge of accident, incident, and emergency procedures and to report any incidents in the correct way.
- To always adhere to SECATs Safeguarding & Child protection policy
- To be responsible for the collection and care of sports equipment
- To ensure equity in sport and promote fair play and the school games values where appropriate
- To promote exit routes to individuals whenever possible
- To promote our work by always maintaining high standards of personal appearance and adopting a friendly, professional approach to the public.

Learning and pastoral duties

- Promote the general progress and well-being of pupils and work in collaboration with school teams to alert appropriate staff to any problems experienced by pupils.
- Communicate as appropriate with parents/carers of pupils outside of the school concerned with the welfare if individuals, after consultation with appropriate staff.
